RESOLUTION NO. 112-2024

APPROVING RESOLUTION NO. 2023-232 OF THE SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF SISON, PANGASINAN, ENTITLED "APPROVING THE ANNUAL INVESTMENT PROGRAM CY 2024 OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF SISON, PROVINCE OF PANGASINAN"

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Bayan of Sison, Pangasinan submitted its Resolution No. 2023-232 to the Sangguniang Panlalawigan for review and evaluation pursuant to Section 56 of Republic Act No.7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991;

WHEREAS, the Committee on Laws and Ordinances of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan with the technical assistance of the Provincial Planning and Development Officer have conducted initial review and study on said Resolution with the following findings:

1. In pursuance to Sections 106, 109, and 114 of the Local Government Code of 1991. The Local Development Council of Sison, Pangasinan has formulated the municipality's Annual Investment Program for Calendar Year 2024, which was endorsed to the Sangguniang Bayan for approval through MDC Resolution No. 03-2023, Series of 2023 dated July 28, 2023;
2. The AIP of the municipality is in accordance with the Budget Operations Manual (BOM) for LGUs, 2016 Edition and in pursuance to DILG-NEDA-DBM-DOF Joint Memorandum Circular No. 1 series of 2007 dated March 8, 2007, DBM-CCC-DILG JMC No. 2014-01 dated August 7, 2014, as amended by DBM-CCC-DILG JMC No. 2015-01 dated July 23, 2015 as to format and content. The AIP of Sison, Pangasinan was formulated following the prescribed AIP Summary Form categorized into general public, social, economic, and other services. It likewise covers: (a)

- all the regular budgetary items for the operations of the different municipal offices broken down into PS, MOOE, and Capital Outlay; (b) the priority development programs/projects and those to be funded by the 20% development fund, and (c) disaster risk reduction management programs/projects/activities of the municipality. It further includes the following: 1) Gender and Development Plan, Peace and Order Plan, Local Nutrition Action Plan, Tourism and Cultural and Arts Programs, Local Climate Change Action Plan, Local Youth Development Plan, Annual Procurement Plan, and; 2) list of programs/projects/activities for the Local Council for Protection of Children, Senior Citizens and Persons with Disabilities, PPAs to combat Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome;
3. The proposed AIP has a total investment requirement of Php247,862,229.00 which will be funded from the municipality's proposed 2024 Annual Budget amounting to Php247,862,229.00 enacted on November 6, 2023 through Appropriation Ordinance No. 02, Series 2023;
 4. The development fund amounting to Php38,079,046.00, which is allocated for development projects, is equivalent to 20% of the municipality's NTA amounting to Php190,395,229.00 for CY 2024. This is in accordance with Section 287 of R.A. 7160;
 5. The identified development programs/projects to be funded by the 20% of NTA are based on the DILG-DOF-DBM Joint Memorandum Circular No. 1 dated November 4, 2020 (Revised Guidelines on the Appropriation and Utilization of the 20% of the Annual Internal Revenue Allotment for Development Projects);
 6. The identified programs/projects/activities to be funded by the 5% Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund of the municipality amounting to Php12,393,112.00, conforms with Section 21 of RA 10121. The 70% of the 5% LDRRMF amounting to Php8,675,178.00 is allocated for disaster risk reduction programs/projects in accordance with NDRRMC-DBM and DILG Memo Circular No. 2013-1 dated March 25, 2013 (Allocation and Utilization of Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund). Further, the LDRRM Plan 2021-2025 of the municipality has been reviewed by the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) as per attached OCD Certification dated August 25, 2023;
 7. The LGU has also identified programs/projects/activities responsive to climate change and tagged its corresponding expenditures in their AIP. This is in pursuance to DBM-CCC-DILG Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2015-01 dated July 23, 2015; and
