RESOLUTION NO. 462-2022

DECLARING THE SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET NO. 1 FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2022 OF MAPANDAN, PANGASINAN INVOLVING A TOTAL APPROPRIATION OF P22,032,033.50, OPERATIVE IN ITS ENTIRETY

WHEREAS, pursuant to Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Pangasinan as a legislative body of the Province is empowered to review ordinances authorizing annual or supplemental appropriations of component cities and municipalities in the manner prescribed by law;

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Bayan of Mapandan, Pangasinan submitted its Supplemental Budget No. 1 for Calendar Year 2022 involving total appropriations of **P22,032,033.50**, which was enacted on March 9, 2022 through Appropriation Ordinance No. 1, Series of 2022;

WHEREAS, the Committee on Laws and Ordinances of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan with the technical assistance of the Local Finance Committee of the Province pursuant to Section 316 of the Local Government Code of 1991, have conducted review and study on said budget with the following findings:

1. That the funding sources for the subject Supplemental Budget were determined in accordance with Section 321 of R.A. No. 7160 and Article 417 (a) of its IRR as amended by Administrative Order No. 47 dated April 12, 1993;



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2. That the creation of position shall be in accordance with the provisions of Civil Service Commission Memorandum Circular No. 19, S-1992 dated May 07, 1992 re Guidelines and Standards in the Establishment of Organizational Structures and Staffing Patterns in Local Government Units, and that priority shall be given to the creation of mandatory positions;
3. That the appropriation for Service Recognition Incentive shall only be disbursed upon issuance of guidelines granting the same, otherwise, the same shall be deemed bereft of legal basis;
4. That the purchase of motor vehicles shall be subject to the provisions of Budget Circular No. 2022-1 dated February 11, 2022 re: Omnibus Guidelines on the Acquisition, Use, Rental and Replacement of Government Motor Vehicles;
5. That the appropriations for devolved functions and services in FY 2022 shall be in accordance with the provisions of executive Order No. 138 dated June 1, 2021 and DILG-DBM Joint Memorandum Circular (JMC) No. 2021-1 dated August 11, 2021, and shall be consistent with the Devolution Transition Plan of the municipality;
6. That all programs, projects and activities shall be in accordance with the approved Local Development Plan and FY 2022 Supplemental Investment Program of the municipality formulated pursuant to DILG-NEDA_DBM-DOF Joint Memorandum Circular No. 1, series of 2007 dated March 08, 2007; and
7. That all procurements to be undertaken shall be subject to the provisions of R.A. No. 9184 (The Government Procurement Reform Act) and its revised Implementing Rules and Regulations.

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlalawigan after final evaluation, finds the same in order provided that the findings shall be complied with by the municipality;

WHEREFORE, in view of the foregoing, on motion of SP Members Vici M. Ventanilla and Angel M. Baniqued, Jr. and co-sponsored by SP Members Sheila Marie S. Perez-Galicia, Jerome Vic O. Espino and Jeanne Jinky C. Zaplan, duly seconded, it was –
