CERTIFICATION

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

THIS IS TO CERTIFY that at the regular session duly constituted of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, Province of Pangasinan, held on November 20, 1998 at Lingayen, Pangasinan, the following ordinance was approved:

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Provincial Ordinance No. 74-98 seeks to implement Section 468, par. (a), sub-par. 4 (ix) of Republic Act 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, empowering the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, as the legislative body of the province, to establish a Provincial Council for the Elderly which shall formulate policies and adopt measures mutually beneficial to the elderly and to the province. The Ordinance will likewise seek to provide a mechanism that will focus and highlight the contributions of the senior citizens to nation building.

As of the 2nd quarter of 1998, there are already 140,868 senior citizens in Pangasinan, outside Dagupan City, belonging to the CLIENTELE group composed of citizens 60 years and above whose annual income is \$\mathbb{P}60,000.00 or less. Those belonging to the RESOURCE group whose annual income is more than \$\mathbb{P}60,000.00 is not yet verified but more or less estimated at about 100,000.

The Asia Training Center on Ageing (ATCOA) has noted that in the demography of human population, there is a dramatic rise in older population in almost all the countries in the world as a consequence of the rapid decline of fertility. Mortality and morbidity rate based on the United Nations report. In the Philippines, the rise is attributed to the population control program of the government.

Senior citizens may render services consisting of, but not limited to tutorial and/or consultancy services, actual teaching and demonstration of hobbies and income generating skills, lectures in specialized fields like agriculture, health, environmental protection and the like.

> To perform such other duties and functions as maybe prescribed by laws and relevant ordinance.

SECTION 3 - Meeting and Quorum.

- The Provincial Council shall meet at least once every quarter or as often as maybe necessary upon call of the Chairman and/or Vice Chairman.
- b. The affirmative vote of majority of the members of the Council shall be necessary to adopt any policy or program for the elderly.

SECTION 4 - Compensation and Remuneration.

The Chairman, Vice Chairman and Members of the Provincial Council shall perform their duties as such without compensation or remuneration, except the President of the Provincial Federation of the Elderly for Senior Citizens who shall be entitled to a reasonable honorarium to be determined by the Council.

SECTION 5 - The amount of Two Hundred Thousand Pesos (P200,000.00) is hereby appropriated from any available funds of the Provincial Treasurer.

SECTION 6 - Effectivity. This Ordinance shall effect upon approval by the Sanggunian take Panlalawigan.
